SITUATION OVERVIEW

Severe cyclonic storm 'Tauktae' weakened into a cyclonic storm and lay centred at 1130 hrs IST of 18th May 2021 over Saurashtra. It moved northeast wards with a speed of 12 kmph during past 06 hours and would move further north-northeastwards and will weaken gradually into a deep depression during next 06 hours.

ASSOCIATED HAZARDS



STRONG WIND: Gale wind speed reaching 80-90 kmph gusting to 100 kmph is likely to prevail over gulf of Khambhat & adjoining northeast Arabian sea during next 06 hours. it is likely to reduce gradually thereafter. squally wind likely to prevail over south Rajasthan from the evening of 18th till 19th early morning.



HEAVY RAIN: Light to moderate rainfall at many places with heavy to very heavy falls at isolated places over Gujarat region and Saurashtra on 18th May.



STORM SURGE: Tidal wave above astronomical tide is likely to inundate coastal areas during next 03 hours.



SEA CONDITIONS: Sea conditions will be very rough to High over Gulf of Khambhat and adjoining northeast Arabian Sea and along & off south Gujarat, Daman, Diu, Dadra & Nagar Haveli coasts during next 12 hours and improve gradually thereafter.

IMPACT / ACTIONS TAKEN

- Around 16,500 houses were destroyed and some 40,000 trees uprooted.
- Over two lakh people had been evacuated in advance, but tens of thousands more were forced to flee from coastal villages.
- 44 disaster response teams were working with local authorities in 20 districts to provide aid.
- 1,000 Covid hospitals Gujarat has around one lakh active cases in coastal towns were given generators
 to maintain electricity supply. He also said there was a buffer stock of 1,700 metric tonnes of liquid
 oxygen to be used for emergencies, and that 744 doctors and 160 'ICU on wheels' had been deployed.
- Indian Navy has rescued 177 people from barges that were carrying 410 people and went adrift in the Arabian Sea near Mumbai. Search continues for 93 people who were onboard the Barge that first went adrift and subsequently sunk at Bombay Hight some 175 kms from Mumbai.
- 7 people killed in Gujarat, 3 in Maharashtra, 8 in Karnataka and 7 in Kerala.
- Six Army team activated for rescue, relief operations in Diu.











Mumbai received 230 mm rainfall due to the cyclonic storm "Tauktae", the highest 24-hour downpour in May in the recorded history.

"Tauktae" is the fifth-strongest Arabian Sea cyclone on record.
